II. DENTAL HYGIENE LAB (DHLAB)

DHLAB is where the popular Dental Hygiene program and state-ofthe-art Dental Hygiene Clinic are located. The clinic offers discounted dental hygiene services to the public allowing students in the program to get the real-world experience while also serving the community.

12. TECHNOLOGY & PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMS (TPP)

TPP houses the Division of Business, Industry and Technology (BIT) which offers courses, degrees and certificates in the areas of business and entrepreneurship, computer technology, digital media, engineering technology and design, and sport fitness and recreation management. The building also features lab space, classrooms and faculty offices.

13. LIFETIME SPORTS COMPLEX (LS)

With two gymnasiums, a full-equipped fitness center, dance studio and more, LS is the go-to place for all things athletics, fitness and recreation while on campus. Here you will also find the offices for TCC Athletics and Intramural Sports are also housed here.

1. STUDENT UNION (SU)

The Student Union is the heart of TCC's campus and where you will find important offices such as Admissions and Records, the Advising Center, Financial Aid, the Cashier's Office, SLICE, and the Accessibility & Resource Center. Stock up on everything from course materials to branded apparel in the Bookstore located on the first floor. Also enjoy the comfortable lounge, a food court with multiple dining options, and a full-service coffee shop with attached outdoor patio.

2. HUMANITIES & SOCIAL SCIENCES (HSS)

The T.K. Wetherell History and Social Sciences Building houses the Division of Behavioral, Social Sciences & Education (BSSE) which offers courses in areas such as Education, Psychology and Public Administration and enrichment programs like Model UN and Brain Bowl. The building was named after TCC's fourth president and features classrooms, plenty of study areas and BSSE faculty offices.

3. COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY (CT)

In addition to classrooms, computer labs and study areas, CT is also home to Veterans Affairs and the Richard W. & Karen B. Moore Veterans Success Center, named after TCC District Board of Trustee member Karen B. Moore and her husband Richard, founders of the Moore Veterans Leadership Academy.

4. LEARNING COMMONS (LC)

One of the most treasured resources on campus, the William D. Law, Jr. Learning Commons offers tutoring, technology assistance, private study rooms and computer access free of charge to all currently enrolled TCC students. The building's iconic columns also make it one of the most photographed spots on campus. It was named after TCC's fifth president, Dr. William D. Law Jr.

5. LIBRARY (LB)

The TCC Library is a vital resource on campus, and a hub of activity where many students spend their time throughout the semester studying, researching or exploring the book stacks between classes. Check out everything from laptops to phone chargers to a class textbook, or meet one-on-one with one of our friendly librarians to assist you with your latest research project.

6. ADMINISTRATION BUILDING (AD)

The Hinson Administration Building was named after TCC's third president, Dr. James H. Hinson, Jr. and it houses the administrative offices of the College including, the office of the Provost, the Business Office, Human Resources, Communications and Marketing and the Office of the President. It is also where the Information Desk can be found which handles all lost and found items.

7. CENTER BUILDING (CB)

CB is where you will find the IT Help Desk. Walk-ins are welcome if students are having technical problems with College systems or their own devices. TCC Police Department is located on the second floor and can assist you with all things safety-related while you are on campus.

8. FINE & PERFORMING ARTS CENTER (FPAC)

With two arts galleries – the Hurst Gallery and the TCC Fine Arts Gallery – and Turner Auditorium housed within, FPAC is a must see for artists and non-artists alike. It's is also home to Theatre TCC!, the Honors Program and exclusive Honors Lounge, the Testing Center, and the Meditation Room.

9. COMMUNICATIONS & HUMANITIES (CH) / ENGLISH (EN)

The CH and adjacent EN buildings house the Division of Communications and Humanities (CH) which offers courses in English, foreign languages, fine and performing arts, literature, religion, philosophy and more, as well as programs like the celebrated Forensics Speech and Debate, study abroad, Art Club and the African Drum and Dance Ensemble. Some features of CH include the arts studios and the offices for the Eyrie, the Talon and Model UN.

10. SCIENCE & MATHEMATICS (SM) / ACADEMIC COMPUTING (AC)

SM houses the Division of Science and Mathematics which offers a variety of science and math courses for students interested in STEM fields, or who just want to complete general education requirements. Most science labs are located here. The adjacent AC building is home to the Dr. Lei Wang STEM Center, an interactive learning space for students interested in the STEM fields and named for Associate Vice President for Institutional Effectiveness Lei Wang.
